





A species is extinct when the last existing member dies. Extinction therefore becomes a certainty when there are no surviving individuals that can reproduce and create a new generation. A species may become <u>functionally</u> <u>extinct</u> when only a handful of individuals survive, which cannot reproduce due to poor health.

Back Habitat loss animal extinction

Habitat loss poses the greatest threat to species. The world's forests, swamps, plains, lakes, and other habitats continue to disappear as they are harvested for human consumption and cleared to make way for agriculture, housing, roads, pipelines and the other hallmarks of industrial development.

What does the SORT UP app do?

The app helps people to sort the garbage in the correct bins, so that everything that should be getting recycled is getting **recycled or reused** in the correct manner.

The user is directed to a **list of different materials and items**, the users **find** the item or material or **can scan** it if unknown.

The app tells the user how to **recycle** correctly their trash.

Additionally, it tells the user if their material can be **reused**. For example if they want to re-use their plastic bottle it gives them a list of example of what they can make with the material or if can be donated to a charity.

The App is interactive and allows to collect and share points on Social Media.

Your object is PLASTIC

How to dispose and recycle: Rinse the object, it is important to recycle clean plastic Insert in the object in the plastic recycle container or collect more plastic in a plastic bag and bring to the recycling station.

- A plastic bottle can be re used to make a bird feeder, egg yolk seperater, piggy bank or a pencil case.

- reuse plastic contaiers as storage and organizers

Your object is PAPER

To recycle paper you should put it in the paper bin, this is the same for cardboard. Make sure not to put cardboard and paper in the same bin.

These are some ways to re-use paper: - Use newspaper as wrapping paper - Use newspaper to clean windows - Put on the floor while painting - If it is printed paper then you can and not double sided you can use the other side for something such as drawing, sketching, doodling and oragimi.

- For books you can give to a charity such as the red cross or give them to a friend.

Chip bags

Chip bags should not be receycaled and should be thrown in the garabge bin. But you can reuse them too before disposing of them!

Some ideas are:

Gift bags, turn inside out and wash the grease, use the silver side on the ouside add a ribbon and done.

- Make a shoulder bag, purse, wallet or pencil case.

Make a scrap book.

Make a braclet, gum wrapper style, or cover an old braclet with the chip bag. COLLECT YOUR BADGE AND

If you don't know what your object is made from, you can scan it with your phone camera!!

Result: mixed materials object

Action: separate the plastic from the paper and recycle them separately in appropriate containers
